We look forward to an exciting 2017.




The Cover and Back

"Dear friends in our industry!

Once a year I get the chance to report you something around us.



This year actually has been a busy year for us. We kept running various quality assurances, inspections and shipments for our carbon materials. Thanks to all the friends in the industry to make us very much active in the black business!

As you know, we have both quality SIM-G and SIM-Gd for graphitized cathode blocks. In the past five years both qualities have been tried in quite some smelters outside China. In the same time, we continue to improve the quality and quality consistency of our blocks, as we understand the single block quality will decide the whole pot-line performance. The efforts have been paid off as last year the trials have been expended.

As to our sidewall carbon blocks our performance keeps well. We have to say that our SSB carbon sidewall block quality has reached a very stable and steady level. Our regular inspections to our plant in Shanxi have proved our confidence. Same as last year, we shall prepare our SPC report and you will read the key property performance from it.

Aluminium industry is in the recovering stage this year. We have seen some good signs in China and outside as well. We expect this trend will keep upwarding in the coming years to make our industry running healthily again both to the smelters but also to our suppliers.

At the end, may this short letter bring you healthiness, happiness and peacefulness. Wishing you a great New Year!



The first company name plate




We recently discovered the very first bronze plate for our company back from when our founder and father Jorgen Simonsen decided to go solo and make his own company.
